**RECITALS**

At its public meeting on February 8, 2019, the Arizona State Board of Occupational Therapy (“Board”) pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-3401 *et seq.*, and Elizabeth Lockett (“Respondent”) entered into the following Non-Disciplinary Consent Agreement.

**CONSENT AGREEMENT**

1. Respondent has read and understands this Consent Agreement and has had the opportunity to discuss this Consent Agreement with an attorney or has waived the opportunity to discuss this Consent Agreement with an attorney.
2. Respondent understands that she has a right to a public administrative hearing concerning this matter, at which hearing she could present evidence and cross-examine witnesses. By entering into this Consent Agreement, Respondent knowingly and voluntarily relinquishes all right to such an administrative hearing, as well as rights of rehearing, review, reconsideration, appeal, judicial review or any other administrative and/or judicial action, concerning the matters set forth herein.
3. Respondent affirmatively agrees that this Consent Agreement shall be irrevocable.
4. Respondent understands that this Consent Agreement or any part of the agreement

1 may be considered in any future disciplinary action by the Board.

2 5. Respondent understands that this Consent Agreement does not constitute a  
3 dismissal or resolution of any other matters currently pending before the Board, if any,  
4 and does not constitute any waiver, express or implied, of the Board's statutory authority  
5 or jurisdiction regarding any other pending or future investigation, action or proceeding.  
6 Respondent also understands that acceptance of this Consent Agreement does not  
7 preclude any other agency, subdivision, or officer of this State from instituting any other  
8 civil or criminal proceedings with respect to the conduct that is the subject of this  
9 Consent Agreement.

10 6. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that, upon signing this Consent Agreement  
11 and returning this document to the Board's Executive Director, she may not revoke her  
12 acceptance of the Consent Agreement or make any modifications to the document  
13 regardless of whether the Consent Agreement has been signed by the Executive Director.  
14 Any modification to this original document is ineffective and void unless mutually agreed  
15 by the parties in writing.

16 7. If a court of competent jurisdiction rules that any part of this Consent Agreement  
17 is void or otherwise unenforceable, the remainder of the Consent Agreement shall remain  
18 in full force and effect.

19 8. Respondent understands that this Consent Agreement is a public record that may  
20 be publicly disseminated as a formal action of the Board and may be reported as required  
21 by law to the National Practitioner's Data Bank and the Healthcare Integrity and  
22 Protection Data Bank.

23 9. Respondent understands that any violation of this Consent Agreement may result  
24 in disciplinary action.

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1 10. Respondent agrees that the Board adopts the following Findings of Fact,  
2 Conclusions of Law and Order.
